Using PayPal and a Masked Credit Card

Coaching sessions are done by telephone and, to maintain anonymity, clients may use a fictitious name and telephone masking services like **Google Voice**. To guarantee satisfaction, clients pay after each coaching session only if and when they want to schedule another session. Payments are done by credit card through PayPal, but clients do not need to have a Paypal account, and credit card masking services like **Abine's Blur** may be used (<http://www.abine.com/maskme/features/cards>).*

Using PayPal as below, Robert sees the amount paid and your masked billing name, email address, and shipping address. He sees nothing else (billing address, credit card number, phone number, etc.).

1. Go to this website: **<http://paypal.com/xclick/business=trafn@yahoo.com>**
2. Confirm that Robert's email - **trafn@yahoo.com** - is in the top left of the screen.
3. Enter the payment amount into **Your order summary** near the top left of the screen:

Leave the description blank and enter **200.00** for the amount

Click **Update** and wait for both sides of the screen to update

4. Pay by credit card:

Click **Pay with a debit or credit card, or PayPal Credit** (bottom right of the screen)

If you use a masked credit card service, follow their instructions on how to mask the information Robert receives: billing name, email address, and shipping address. Nothing will be emailed or shipped to you.

If you do not use a masked credit card, or you have any questions, contact Robert to discuss how you can limit the amount of your personal information he receives.

Click **Pay** - all payments are for services rendered prior to payment and, therefore, are final and non-refundable.

5. On the next screen where it asks you to create a PayPal account, click **No Thanks**, and then a printable receipt will appear. Remember, you will not receive a receipt by email.
6. Call Robert to schedule your next coaching session, or if you have any questions.
