WHY AM I TRANSFERRING?

Instead of trying to explain all of the changes the DEA is making to telemedicine, tell your new physician that Dr. Mitchell is retiring and you need to find a new doctor to prescribe your medication.

WHAT WAS I PRESCRIBED?

Your new doctor can find all of your prescriptions from Dr. Mitchell for the past two years in the Florida Prescription Drug Monitoring Program which is called E-FORCSE. All doctors have access to this information online.

HOW DO I TRANSFER?

- If you have a primary care doctor, ask if they or someone they know prescribes your medication. A special license is <u>no longer</u> required, so all doctors can now prescribe your medication, though not all doctors do.
- 2. Ask your **pharmacist**. They fill prescriptions for many doctors, so they might be able to refer you to someone who can help you.
- 3. If you have **insurance**, ask if they have a preferred provider near you who prescribes your medication.
- 4. Call **211** which is your county's health and legal information line to see if they can help you find a prescribing doctor.
